**PREPARATION OF THE ANNUAL SECURITY REPORT**

Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine (LECOM) publishes this report to inform the LECOM community about campus security policies and the occurrence of crime on all LECOM campuses. LECOM has a signed Program Participation Agreement with the Federal Government to receive Title IV funding for LECOM students. LECOM agrees to be administratively capable of following Federal Department of Education guidelines, including under the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security and Crimes Statistics Act (the Clery Act). This report complies with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security and Crime Statistics Act (the Clery Act) and uses information maintained by the LECOM Campus Police and Security Department, Seton Hill University Police Department for the LECOM at Seton Hill location, and local law enforcement agencies. Additionally, other LECOM resources, including but not limited to, Student Affairs, Human Resources, and Administration, Faculty, and staff are essential to campus safety and are indispensable to compliance with the Clery Act. This report provides statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on LECOM campuses, in certain off-campus buildings or property owned, leased, or controlled by LECOM, and on public property adjacent to LECOM campuses. This report also includes required crime statistics that have been reported to Campus Security Authorities (CSAs). CSAs are individuals that have interaction with students and have significant responsibility for those students. LECOM distributes a notice of the availability of this Annual Security Report to every member of the LECOM community by October 1 of each year. **LECOM POLICE AND SECURITY OFFICE**

The LECOM Police and Security Office is responsible for the provision of law enforcement and security for LECOM (all Erie, PA locations). Its mission is to provide a safe and secure environment for the students, faculty, and staff of LECOM. The Office ensures that the community and facilities remain secure through professional, proactive, and quality prevention, suppression, and investigation of criminal activity or unsafe physical, operational, or environmental conditions on the campuses and properties under the control of LECOM. Campus security is provided twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

At LECOM Erie, the Department includes both sworn Campus Police Officers and Security Officers; LECOM Police and Security patrol all Erie facilities. At LECOM Bradenton, the Department consists only of Security Officers. Security is provided at DeFuniak Springs campus by contracted security, however coverage by the contracted security is not 24/7. DeFuniak Springs campus is located within the jurisdiction of DeFuniak Springs Police Department, who patrol the campus 24/7. Security at LECOM at Seton Hill is provided by the Seton Hill University Police Department. Seton Hill University Police are also responsible for patrolling the Seton Hill University campus.

LECOM police officers in Pennsylvania possess full police authority under Pennsylvania Title 22, Act 501. Under PA Title 22, Act 501, LECOM police have the authority to arrest and exercise all other police powers in the same manner and with the same authority as any municipal police officer in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. LECOM police officers have been appropriately trained and certified according to Pennsylvania requirements, and may carry firearms and less lethal weapons while on duty for the protection of the LECOM community. At the Main campus in Erie, LECOM Police will usually be dressed in full uniform, but may on occasion be in civilian clothes with a badge displayed on their belt. Bradenton Security officers are uniformed.

LECOM Security Officers are not police officers. They perform the duties of, and are empowered by, LECOM to enforce policies established by the institution. In addition, they staff the Security Office, monitor the surveillance camera system, patrol the campus and assist police officers in the performance of their duties.

## **REPORTING A CRIME**

Any victim of a crime, including but not limited to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, either on or off campus, is encouraged to report the incident to the appropriate law enforcement agency. Every member of the LECOM community is required to report a crime promptly *if the victim wants a report to be made or is unable to make a report*. Moreover, the LECOM Police and Security Office reports crimes occurring on campus or non-campus buildings or property to the federal and state governments as required by law.

Reports can be made by calling the numbers listed below under “Security Locations and Phone Numbers.” Reports can also be made in person at the LECOM Police and Security Offices or Seton Hill University Police Department. LECOM Police and Security Offices will refer or investigate all reports of criminal activity received from any source. Investigations of serious crimes will be referred to the local, state or federal law enforcement agencies, as appropriate. In addition, LECOM Police and Security will investigate any criminal incidents on the LECOM campuses that are not investigated by the local police as a result of being a low priority.

A “Campus Security Authority” (CSA) is a Clery Act term that encompasses individuals that may receive reports of crimes, including all LECOM Police and Security officers. While LECOM has identified several non-police/security Campus Security Authorities (CSAs), LECOM officially designates the LECOM Campus Police and Security Office to receive reports of crimes at the

Erie, Pennsylvania and Bradenton, Florida locations, the DeFuniak Springs Police Department to receive reports at DeFuniak Springs, Florida, and the Seton Hill University Police Department to receive reports of crimes at LECOM at Seton Hill in Greensburg, Pennsylvania. A list of some designated LECOM Administrative CSAs follows below.

Crimes reported to police agencies will be documented and investigated appropriately. As appropriate, those accused of crimes may be referred to judicial affairs for disciplinary action and/or criminally charged. If found guilty, potential outcomes include dismissal from LECOM and/or criminal sanctions imposed by criminal courts.

Orders of protection, no contact orders, restraining orders, or similar lawful orders issued by a court should be provided to the LECOM Police and Security Offices or Seton Hill University Police Department.

### **Working with Other Law Enforcement Agencies**

The LECOM Department of Police and Security has a close working relationship with local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies. Local law enforcement is able to monitor and record criminal activity at non-campus locations of officially recognized LECOM activities. The Erie Bureau of Police maintains primary jurisdiction on the LECOM facilities in the City of Erie for all serious criminal investigations. The Millcreek Township Police maintains primary jurisdiction on the LECOM facilities in Millcreek Township for all serious criminal investigations. LECOM police conduct investigations on those criminal incidents not investigated by the Erie Police/Millcreek Township Police. In Bradenton, the Manatee County Sheriff's Department provides law enforcement coverage for the campus. In DeFuniak Springs, Florida, the location of the LECOM School of Dental Medicine's DeFuniak Springs Dental Offices, the DeFuniak Springs Police Department provides law enforcement.

At Seton Hill University, the working relationship of the Seton Hill University Police with the City of Greensburg Police is very close and there is daily contact with the Greensburg Police Department. The City Police cars cruise through the campus on a frequent basis, twenty-four hours a day. The relationship with the Pennsylvania State Police is professionally cordial, but their services are seldom needed due to the close working relationship with the City of Greensburg Police.

LECOM Police and Security, through LECOM, has a written Memorandum of Understanding with both Millcreek Township Police and City of Erie Police, which details the responsibilities and duties of all three police agencies, as explained above. There is no written memorandum of understanding between LECOM and the Pennsylvania State Police; Seton Hill University Police; Greensburg, PA Police; Manatee County, Fl. Sheriff's Department; or DeFuniak Springs Police Department.

**CONFIDENTIALITY IN REPORTING A CRIME**

It is critical for the safety of the entire LECOM community that all incidents are reported immediately so that the LECOM Police and Security Department, the Seton Hill University Police Department, or the local police department can investigate the situation and determine if follow-up actions are required, including LECOM issuing a timely warning or emergency notification. If crimes are never reported, little can be done to help other members of the community from also becoming victims. LECOM community members are encouraged to report crimes promptly and to participate in and support crime prevention efforts. If you are the victim of a crime or want to report a crime you are aware of, but do not want to pursue action within the LECOM disciplinary system, please consider filing a voluntary, confidential report. Depending upon the circumstances of the crime you are reporting, you may be able to file a report while maintaining your confidentiality. The purpose of a confidential report is to comply with your wish to keep your personally identifying information confidential, while taking steps to ensure your safety and the safety of others. The confidential reports allow LECOM to compile accurate records on the number and types of incidents occurring on our campuses. Reports filed in this manner are counted and disclosed in the Annual Security Report. In limited circumstances, your confidentiality may not be able to be assured and in that circumstance, you will be informed. Anyone may call to report a crime. Callers may remain anonymous.

*The general rule pursuant to the Clery Act is that crimes reported to pastoral or professional counselors are included in Clery "exemptions;" where such exemptions apply, those crimes will not be included in Clery Act statistics unless voluntarily provided for use in the Annual Security Report by such counselors. There are no LECOM employees, including the Directors of Behavioral Health at LECOM Erie and LECOM Bradenton, who provide officially sanctioned confidential counseling at LECOM. With no officially recognized pastoral or counseling service exemptions at LECOM, there are no written procedures to encourage pastoral or professional counselors to report Clery crimes to the LECOM Police and Security Department. Behavioral*

Health personnel employed by LECOM are also Campus Security Authorities. There are no recognized non-campus student organizations.

## **CAMPUS FACILITIES**

### *Security of, and Access to, Academic and Administrative Buildings*

LECOM desires to create a safe, supportive environment for its students and employees. To this end, LECOM created several programs to ensure campus safety. LECOM facilities are well maintained and security is given consistent attention to protect students, staff, and faculty. Generally, LECOM facilities are open from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m., Monday through Friday during academic sessions. Saturday, Sunday and holiday facility hours are 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. Times may vary by location and during examination periods or special events.

For convenience in reporting crimes or unusual incidents, the emergency number for police, fire and ambulance is posted on telephones in the college facility. The 911 emergency system serves the area. At LECOM at Seton Hill, Seton Hill University Police patrol the campus.

### *Security Considerations in Maintenance of Campus Facilities*

Landscaping and outdoor lighting on campus are designed for security. Sidewalks are designed to provide well-traveled, lit routes from parking areas to buildings. Grounds-keeping personnel trim shrubs from sidewalks and the building entrances to provide a safe, well-lighted route to the buildings. All campus lighting is routinely inspected. Night security personnel are available to escort people to the parking areas. Fire extinguishers and fire hoses are placed throughout LECOM for safety. Emergency defibrillators (AEDs) are also located at key locations for emergency use.

In an effort to maintain the highest levels of campus safety and security, no costumes, dress, or masks including mascot uniforms which alter, cloak, or conceal an individual's identity are permitted on any LECOM property. This includes Halloween attire. This is done to maintain the safe community that we enjoy on the LECOM campuses.

Although LECOM provides campus safety and security, LECOM cannot guarantee each student's and employee's safety. LECOM does not have absolute control over the surrounding area. Each member of the LECOM community must assume responsibility for helping prevent sexual assaults or other crimes through increased awareness, behavior guided by reason, and by taking precautionary steps to avoid situations that lead to the possible occurrence of crime.

## **DAILY LOG**

The LECOM Police and Security Office maintains a daily log of all criminal and non-criminal incidents that occur on the campuses and satellite facilities pursuant to federal and state statutes. The contents of this log are open to public inspection. Any student or prospective

student, faculty member or staff member of LECOM wishing to examine the Daily Log may do so. The Log is located in the Campus Police and Security Office. At LECOM at Seton Hill, the Log is located in the office of the Seton Hill University Police Department. Requests to view the document can be made to any police or security officer on-duty in the office during hours when the building is open for business.

Personally identifiable information about victims of the crimes of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking shall not be available in any publicly available record-keeping, including the reporting and disclosure of crime statistics.

Another exception to the release of information pertaining to a criminal offense may occur when there is clear and convincing evidence that the release of the information would jeopardize an ongoing criminal investigation or the safety of an individual, or cause a suspect to flee or evade detection, or result in the destruction of evidence. The information will, however, become public when damage is no longer likely to occur as the result of its release.

## **CAMPUS SECURITY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM**

LECOM will inform the campus community concerning security matters through the issuance of timely warnings whenever emergency, safety, or security issues arise that pose a threat or will have a significant impact on security for students and employees. Such issues shall include, but not be limited to, criminal activity on or near a LECOM campus, crime prevention warnings and techniques, and changes to security policy or procedure.

Timely Warnings and/or Emergency Notifications are issued by the Assistant Dean of Clinical Education, the Director of LECOM Police and Security or any Deputy Director of LECOM Police and Security. Timely Warnings and/or Emergency Notifications will also be issued at the direction of the President of LECOM or the Provost of LECOM. *When the nature of the crime or emergency allows the time to do so, individuals authorized to issue such warnings and notifications may confer with the Provost and/or President prior to issuing a Timely Warning or Emergency Notification.* Tests of the LECOM emergency notification system occur approximately semi-annually. In 2017, tests of the system were sent out by E2 Campus (SMS), and by email on March 7, 2017 and September 8, 2017.

The LECOM Security Information Notification System (LSINS) may include (but is not limited to) the following media:

- LECOM Video Bulletin Board
- Campus E-Mail System
- Memoranda or fliers made available to students and/or employees
- Information posted to the LECOM Security Department Home Page
- Omnilert Campus Alert system (formerly known as e2Campus)
- PA System



It is incumbent upon every member of the LECOM community to actively participate in the Campus Security Program by frequently checking and reading the information disseminated through the various media comprising the Security Information Notification System. Any campus security program can only be as effective as the cooperation and acceptance of the LECOM community.

In Calendar year 2017, one Emergency Notification was broadcast to the LECOM, Erie community as follows:

- December 6, 2017-Warning of a human sex trafficker in the Erie area; not specific to the LECOM community, but in the area.

In Calendar year 2017, two Timely Warnings were broadcast to the LECOM community as follows:

- May 1, 2017-Severe weather alert, Erie, PA
- September 9, 2017-Severe weather alert, Florida

### **CAMPUS SECURITY ALERTS - Omnilert "Campus Alert"**

LECOM utilizes Omnilert "Campus Alert" (formerly e2campus), a notification system that enables the school to send urgent news to cell phones. The service is available to all current students and employees. After signing up for the service, LECOM can text cell phones with timely information about emergencies, class cancellations, or critical campus reminders. Registering with the system is necessary to receive the notifications. Depending on personal cell phone plans, there may be a nominal fee from a carrier to receive text messages, but there is no charge from the school to use the service. Beginning in January 2016, Campus Alert is "opt-out." All incoming students are now automatically signed into the Campus Alert notification system. If they do not desire to receive Campus Alert warnings and alerts, they must request, in writing, to be removed from the system.

Students at LECOM at Seton Hill are encouraged to register for Seton Hill University's Campus Alert service so that they may be notified of emergencies, campus closures, or other critical situations on the Seton Hill University campus.

### **EMERGENCY RESPONSE, EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION, AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES**

LECOM will immediately notify the campus community upon the confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or staff occurring "on campus."

LECOM's Safety Committee has developed and maintains an Emergency Response and Evacuation Procedures Manual. It is designed to be an all hazards disaster response and emergency management plan utilized in conjunction with appropriate Timely Warnings and Emergency Notifications. LECOM's priorities during an emergency are life, safety, infrastructure integrity, and environmental protection. LECOM's Safety Committee is comprised of individuals

from all areas within LECOM, including Faculty, Staff, and Administration. Members currently include (but are not limited to): Director of Police and Security; Director of Maintenance; Asst. Dean of Clinical Education; VP of Academic Affairs and Dean of Academic Affairs; VP for LECOM at Seton Hill, Greensburg, PA; and Assoc. Dean, Academic Affairs at LECOM in Bradenton, Florida.

The manual includes information about incident teams, incident priorities, and performance expectations; shelter-in-place and evacuation guidelines; tests of the emergency warning system; and local contingencies. The plans are modified for each campus' unique environment. For instance, the Erie, Pennsylvania campus has plans for massive snow storms and the Bradenton, Florida campus has hurricane contingencies. The plan and manual undergo periodic reviews and testing with planned drills including evacuations, table top exercises, and use of the emergency notification system. There are after action reviews of all exercises and revisions are made as necessitated.

### **STUDENT AND EMPLOYEE RESPONSIBILITY FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY**

LECOM is an exceptionally safe and secure educational institution. However, individual complacency and inattentiveness concerning personal security can negatively impact the entire community. To ensure optimum levels of security, students and employees must assume responsibility for their own safety, as well as the safety and security of all members of the LECOM community. This responsibility includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Report any safety or security concerns to the LECOM Campus Police and Security Office or the Seton Hill University Police Department.
- Report any suspicious persons or situations on campus to the LECOM Campus Police and Security Office or the Seton Hill University Police Department immediately upon discovery.
- Use your issued Card/Key every time you enter or exit a building. Report strangers who do not have a badge and "tailgate" you into a building.
- Strictly obey traffic and parking regulations on campus. This is especially important when driving in congested parking areas and around pedestrian traffic areas.
- Never park, stop or stand in fire lanes. This could cause a serious delay in the response time for fire fighters in the event of a fire emergency on campus.
- Keep personal items that can be stolen inside locked lockers.
- Never leave bags or other personal items in hallways during examinations (they should be in cars or lockers).
- No costumes, dress, or masks, including mascot uniforms, which alter, cloak, or conceal an individual's identity are permitted on any LECOM property.

## **CAMPUS CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAM**

The following crime prevention programs are provided to the LECOM community:

- All employees (Director of Human Resources or their representative) and all incoming first year students (Asst. Dean of Clinical Education or their representative) receive a presentation about safety, crime prevention, crime reporting, and related topics.
- Prior to orientation all in-coming first year students receive an Identification Badge/Card/Key and a Parking Permit.
- All new employees receive an Identification Badge/Card/Key and a Parking Permit.
- The Police and Security Office, in conjunction with the Offices of Student Affairs and Human Resources and the various student organizations, will provide crime awareness and safety presentations as needed or requested throughout the year to students and employees. Such programming includes (but is not limited to) New Hire Orientation, held approximately monthly, at which key LECOM Policies and procedures are discussed, as well as evacuation plans and other vital information needed by new hires.

## **DRUGS, ALCOHOL, AND WEAPONS POLICIES**

LECOM recognizes that professional education may be a time of great stress for students. Therefore, LECOM wants to enable our students and employees to adapt successfully to these stresses without engaging in potentially harmful coping mechanisms such as alcohol or drug abuse. A student or employee who needs help will be assisted promptly to help solve his or her problem in an effective, compassionate, and confidential manner.

The illegal use of controlled substances can seriously injure the health of students and employees by adversely impairing the performance of their responsibilities; endangering the safety and well-being of LECOM community members; jeopardizing LECOM property or that of its members or visitors; or adversely affecting its educational mission. As a consequence, to provide for the safety of the members of the community and its property, LECOM has set the following minimum standards of conduct for all members of the community and for those seeking admission to LECOM.

### **Weapons Policy**

The use, possession, or carrying in any manner or conveyance of firearms, hand billies, dirk knives, or other dangerous cutting instruments, explosives or any other weapons on LECOM-owned or controlled property, at LECOM-sponsored or supervised activities, or at Seton Hill University is strictly forbidden. The only exception is for authorized law enforcement officers. The commission of a serious crime is grounds for immediate discharge from LECOM.

### **Drug-Free Campus Note: Drug and alcohol separated out**

LECOM is dedicated to the safety, health, and welfare of its students and employees by maintaining a drug-free environment. To promote this goal, students and employees are required to report to LECOM in appropriate mental and physical condition to perform their required educational and work tasks in a satisfactory and safe manner. LECOM complies with provisions of the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989. Our rules of conduct prohibit the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs by students or employees on LECOM property: buildings, grounds, vehicles, rental space, affiliated hospitals, or locations of official LECOM functions. Violations of this policy may result in a disciplinary action and an order to participate in a program of rehabilitation and monitoring, suspension, or dismissal of a student or termination of employment of an employee. Such violations may also have legal consequences.

- The illegal use or abuse of legal drugs will not be tolerated.
- While on LECOM premises and while conducting business-related activities off LECOM premises, no employee may use, possess, distribute, sell, or be under the influence of illegal drugs.
- No student shall possess, use, manufacture, produce, sell, exchange, or otherwise distribute any drug prohibited by federal or state law at LECOM.
- Students found by school application process, security background checks, self-disclosure or other means to have a history of use, possession, transportation or any other interactions with illicit substances or that otherwise comes to the attention of law enforcement will be referred to the PHP/SARPh at Erie or LECOM at Seton Hill or to the Florida PRN in Bradenton, possibly for an evaluation. A referral will be made to PHP/SARPh/PRN regardless of legal standing as in cases in which any sentence was fully served prior to enrollment at LECOM or conviction records were expunged. Students will be expected to be monitored throughout their matriculation at LECOM by way of recommendations from PHP/SARPh/PRN or by student request in cases of substance dependency.
- State and Federal laws are enforced by appropriate law enforcement agencies, including (but not limited to) LECOM Police and Security, Millcreek Township Police Department, City of Erie Police Department, and PA State Police.

To inform all LECOM community members about important provisions of this policy, LECOM has established a drug-free and alcohol abuse awareness program. The program provides information on the dangers and effects of substance abuse at LECOM, resources available, and consequences for violations of this policy.

### **Alcohol-Free Campus**

LECOM is dedicated to the safety, health, and welfare of its students and employees by maintaining an alcohol-free environment. To promote this goal, students and employees are required to report to LECOM in appropriate mental and physical condition to perform their

Such violations may also have legal consequences.

- Alcoholic beverages may not be served or consumed on any LECOM campus
- While on LECOM premises and while conducting business-related activities off LECOM premises, no employee may use, possess, distribute, sell, or be under the influence of alcohol.
- No student shall possess, consume, furnish, manufacture, sell, exchange, or otherwise distribute any alcoholic beverage except as permitted by state law and LECOM.
- Students found by school application process, security background checks, self-disclosure or other means to have a history of use, possession, transportation or any other interactions with alcohol or that otherwise comes to the attention of law enforcement will be referred to the PHP/SARPh at Erie or LECOM at Seton Hill or to the Florida PRN in Bradenton, possibly for an evaluation. A referral will be made to PHP/SARPh/PRN regardless of legal standing as in cases in which any sentence was fully served prior to enrollment at LECOM or conviction records were expunged. Students will be expected to be monitored throughout their matriculation at LECOM by way of recommendations from PHP/SARPh/PRN or by student request in cases of alcohol dependency.
- State and Federal laws are enforced by appropriate law enforcement agencies, including (but not limited to) LECOM Police and Security, Millcreek Township Police Department, City of Erie Police Department, and PA State Police.

To inform all LECOM community members about important provisions of this policy, LECOM has established a drug-free and alcohol abuse awareness program. The program provides information on the dangers and effects of substance abuse at LECOM, resources available, and consequences for violations of this policy.

## **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT, AND STALKING; PROGRAMMING AND PROCEDURES TO PREVENT SUCH CRIMES**

### **Domestic violence, Dating violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking are violations of law and LECOM Policy**

Domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking are violations of federal and state laws and violations of the LECOM Policy on Title IX Compliance.

Domestic violence includes felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence committed by a current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim, by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner, by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies, or by any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction.

Dating violence is violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim.

Sexual assault is any type of sexual contact or behavior that occurs without the explicit consent of the recipient. It includes both non-consensual sexual contact and intercourse.

Stalking is a pattern of repeated and unwanted attention, harassment, or any other course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear. Examples of stalking actions include, but are not limited to:

- Repeated, unwanted, intrusive, and frightening communications from the perpetrator by phone, mail, email, text, social media, and/or other means;
- Repeatedly leaving or sending a person unwanted items such as presents or flowers;
- Following or lying in wait for a person at places such as their home, school, work, or a recreation place;
- Making direct or indirect threats to harm a person or the person's children, relatives, friends, or pets;
- Damaging or threatening to damage a person's property;
- Posting information or spreading rumors about a person on the internet, in a public place, by word of mouth, or by other means; or
- Obtaining personal information about a person by accessing public records, using internet search services, hiring private investigators, going through the person's garbage, following the person, contacting a person's friends, family, work, neighbors, or others.

For the purposes of this document and enforcement at LECOM, the following functions as LECOM's definition of consent: consent involves explicit communication. Affirmative consent is a knowing, voluntary, and mutual decision among all participants to engage in sexual activity. Consent can be given by words or actions, as long as those words or actions create clear permission regarding willingness to engage in the sexual activity. Silence or lack of resistance, in and of itself, does not demonstrate consent. The definition of consent does not vary based upon a participant's sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression.

- A sexual encounter is considered consensual when individuals each willingly and knowingly engage in sexual activity. Consent cannot be obtained through the use of coercion. Coercion is the use of pressure, manipulation, substances, force,

and/or disregarding objections of another party to engage in sexual activity. Consent must be clearly and unambiguously communicated.

- Consent to any one sexual act or prior sexual activity does not necessarily constitute consent to any other sexual act. Consent may be given initially but withdrawn at any time. When consent is withdrawn or can no longer be given, sexual activity must stop.
- One who is incapacitated (whether by alcohol or drug use, disability, unconsciousness, or is otherwise helpless) cannot consent to sexual activity.

### **Identifying Sex Offenders**

Incarceration of sex offenders may remove a sex offender from the streets, but it can do nothing to prevent the offender from committing another similar crime when released.

The Federal Campus Crimes Prevention Act, enacted in October 2000, went into effect on October 28, 2002. The law requires institutions of higher education to issue a statement advising the campus community where law enforcement agency information provided by the State concerning registered sex offenders may be obtained. It also requires sex offenders already registered in a state to provide notice, as required, under state law, of each institution of higher education in that state at which a person is employed, carries on a vocation, volunteers services, or is a student.

### ***If you are the victim or witness of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, or Stalking***

LECOM offers educational programming to promote awareness of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking and their prevention each year at orientation to students and annually to employees. Components of the education programs include a statement that these crimes are prohibited at LECOM; definitions of consent, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking; safe and positive bystander intervention when there's a risk of one of those incidents; information on risk reduction to recognize warning signs of abusive behavior and avoiding potential attacks; and information about the institutional disciplinary procedures.

LECOM also directs students and employees who are the victims of crimes to community service and law enforcement organizations as needed and requested.

If a crime of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking should occur, it is recommended, but not mandated, that the offense be reported to the local Police, the LECOM Police and Security Office, and/or the Seton Hill University Police Department as outlined above in the "Reporting a Crime" section. It is critical that fragile evidence of the crime is preserved and collected as soon as possible if subsequent prosecution of the offender is to be successful.

The victim also has the availability of on campus and community counseling services for support and assistance. This is available throughout the investigation and prosecutorial process, if reported, as well as subsequent recovery from the traumatic event. Providers of counseling services are:

If you are the victim of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, there are several options for you to follow. The following are recommended, but not mandated.

- Contact the local police, LECOM Police and Security Office, and/or the Seton Hill University Police Department for assistance and an immediate criminal investigation will be initiated. LECOM personnel will assist a student or employee in notifying these authorities if the student or employee requests this assistance.
- Preserve any physical evidence that may prove that an incident of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking occurred and/or to obtain a protective order.
- You may need to get an immediate medical examination and treatment.
- The examination will determine if you need treatment for injuries or sexually transmitted diseases or pregnancy.
- The examination will also result in the collection of evidence that can be used to identify and convict your attacker.
- You can seek medical attention on your own instead of in conjunction with a report to the police.
- The hospital will treat you and collect the necessary evidence.
- The hospital will notify the police and rape crisis center on your behalf; however, it is

your decision to make if you want them involved.

- Even if you do not think that you want to press charges at the time of the medical examination and treatment, it is important to obtain the evidence in case you change your mind at a later date.
- You can seek the services of counselors who specialize in assisting victims and the families of victims of these crimes. These counselors can give advice, assistance, and accompany you through the process. LECOM personnel will assist a student or employee in contacting counselor(s) if the student or employee requests this assistance. Counseling services are listed immediately above.

Although a criminal investigation and prosecution for the offense is the recommended course of action in cases of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, the ultimate decision for such action rests with the victim. Should the victim decide against law enforcement involvement, administrative disciplinary process may be invoked if a student or employee is the alleged offender. In that case, a report of the incident must be made to the LECOM Institutional Title IX Coordinator or a Deputy Coordinator. The LECOM Institutional Title IX Coordinator and Deputy Coordinators are:

*The Policy Statement on Title IX Compliance and Affirmation of the Prohibition of Sexual Harassment, Misconduct or Violence* document details the procedural process used if the alleged perpetrator of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking is a LECOM student or employee. LECOM recognizes that responding to allegations of this nature, whether in the criminal justice system or LECOM's disciplinary procedures will likely be very stressful for the accused as well as the accuser. LECOM can provide the accused, by referral to the above sections, information about existing counseling, health, mental health, legal assistance, and financial aid services both within LECOM and in the community.

- There will be a prompt, fair, and impartial investigation and resolution.
- The standard of evidence in the disciplinary proceedings regarding allegations of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking is preponderance of the evidence. A decision using the standard of evidence of preponderance of the evidence means that it will be determined based on the evidence presented that it is more likely than not that the offense did or did not occur.
- Both the accuser (“complainant”) and accused (“respondent”) are entitled to the same opportunity to have an advisor during a campus disciplinary process; however the role is purely supportive. The advisor may not speak on behalf of the complainant or respondent.
- Both the complainant and respondent will be simultaneously informed in writing of the outcome of any campus investigation or disciplinary proceeding brought forth due to the allegation of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking as well as possible appeal procedures.
- Interim Measures
  - Following an allegation of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking being asserted to LECOM, a student complainant may request a change in a facet of the academic setting. This request will trigger an identification of

the available options and LECOM will make reasonable changes. These are available regardless of whether the complainant chooses to report the crime to campus police or local law enforcement.

- If the complainant is a LECOM employee, the employee may request a change in employment aspects and LECOM will make reasonable changes.
  - LECOM will also consider, as appropriate, whether and what interim measures and remedies should be provided or offered to the Respondent.
  - Reasonable changes may include, among others, restrictions on contact and/or course schedule or work schedule alteration.
  - If applicable, student financial aid guidance is available.
  - Counseling may be facilitated.
- 
- Possible sanctions for a LECOM student found “responsible” for domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking are disciplinary probation, suspension for a length of time based on the specific circumstances, expulsion, and revocation of degree. Additionally, a student may be subject to a “no-contact” order, required to make restitution, and/or become ineligible to hold a class office or student organization office.
  - If a LECOM employee is found “responsible” for domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, possible sanctions are verbal warning, written warning, suspension for a length of time based on the specific circumstances, and termination.
  - Determinations by a criminal court may separately occur if criminal proceedings are initiated which is separate from LECOM’s disciplinary proceedings.
  - Final results of any LECOM disciplinary hearings will be provided to both the accused and the accuser as soon as practical.

## **HATE CRIMES ARE STRICTLY FORBIDDEN BY LECOM**

A hate crime is a criminal offense committed against a person or property which is motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender’s bias. Bias is a preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on certain characteristics. The Clery Act requires reporting on hate crimes committed due to the perpetrator’s bias towards the victim’s actual or perceived race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity, disability, national origin, or gender identity.

For Clery Act purposes, hate crimes that must be reported include any of the following offenses if the offense is motivated by bias of one of the types listed immediately above.

- Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter
- Negligent Manslaughter
- Rape
- Fondling
- Incest
- Statutory Rape
- Robbery

- Aggravated Assault
- Burglary
- Motor Vehicle Theft
- Arson
- Simple Assault
- Larceny-Theft
- Intimidation
- Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property

As evident by this list, "hate crime" incidents may involve physical assault, damage to property, and theft. They may also involve bullying, harassment, verbal abuse or insults, or offensive graffiti or letters. Anyone engaging in such conduct will be subject to expulsion or discharge from LECOM. Anyone who witnesses such conduct, regardless of whether they are the target, should report the conduct pursuant to the "Reporting a Crime" procedures listed above. LECOM maintains a zero tolerance policy as to hate crimes. Hate crimes are also specifically forbidden by the state criminal laws of both Pennsylvania and Florida.
