DOX	You have earned a baccalaureate degree in nursing from an accredited
	college or university by the time of enrollment to the MSN-CNL program.
	You have a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or greater from your
	undergraduate degree.
	You are licensed as a registered nurse; and that your license is currently
	active, unrestricted or unencumbered from your home State.
	You have secured two letters of recommendations from any professional
	associates familiar with your work as a registered nurse; and other related
	credentials.
	You are a United States citizen; or a permanent resident.
	You have a government issued identification (Driver's license, passport, U.S.
	military ID, etc.).
Graduate of Foreign Nursing Schools (LECOM Policy)	
As a foreign graduate of a nursing school, you may be eligible for review, evaluation,	
	and acceptance into the graduate nursing program.
	You have applied to an active affiliate of the National Association of
	Credential Evaluation Services (<u>www.naces.org</u>) for a course-by-course,
	science-by-science equivalency evaluation. If you have checked this box as
	complete, please request to send your evaluation directly to LECOM's
	Admissions Department; along with your certified true copy of your transcript of records.
	If your undergraduate curriculum and instruction in nursing was not
	conducted in English, a translation of your transcript of records and
	credentials must be secured from an agency affiliated with the National
	Association of Credential Evaluation Services (<u>www.naces.orq</u>).
	If English is not your native language; or if English is not the basis of the
	undergraduate degree in nursing curriculum and instruction as reflected in
	the official transcript of records, you are required to pass the Test of English
	as a Foreign Language with a minimum of B (20 points in reading; 20 points
	in speaking; 20 points in listening; and 20 points in writing).
