Healthcare is a large and complex industry that requires skilled administrators to manage its various demands. These administrators play a critical role in ensuring efficient medical services, incorporating technological advancements, and complying with regulations. The LECOM School of Health Services Administration offers the Masters in Health Services Administration program to train individuals for this challenging and rewarding role.

By enrolling in the M.H.S.A. program, students gain valuable knowledge and skills to effectively lead and manage medical and health service organizations. These skills are applicable to hospitals, acute and subacute healthcare facilities, public healthcare organizations, pharmacies, and private practice groups. This program prepares students for various responsibilities such as planning, directing, and leading healthcare organizations, as well as overseeing fiscal matters and managing clinical practices. The M.H.S.A. program equips individuals with the necessary expertise to address complex issues within the healthcare industry.

#### Curriculum

The M.H.S.A. curriculum consists of 50 credits. There are 10 core courses (30 credits) required for all students. Each student also completes three electives (9 credits). Students must participate in experiential discovery through our executive interview and analysis courses (6 credits). Students complete either a Master's Thesis Project (5 credits) or Capstone Experience (5 credits). All sudents must also pass a final comprehensive exam.
